Dear Senator,

We are the group Washington Sensible Shorelines Association, representing approximately 1000 owners of property on the shores of Lake Sammanish in King County. We are writing you as a last resort, short of litigation, to ask your assistance in ensuring that the Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) fulfills its responsibilities by assuring the proper functioning of the federally funded Sammanish River Flood Control Project (the flood control project or project).

King County, under agreement with the Corps, has been responsible for maintaining the project by removing flow-restricting vegetation. Aware of inadequate maintenance, the Corps forewarned King County that their failure to maintain the project would result in high water levels and property impacts. We are asking for your involvement since our efforts over more than a decade to get the Corps and the County to deal with this matter have been unsuccessful. To expedite your consideration we provide supplemental, supporting information.

As noted, the County agreed to maintain river flow capacity - the result being adequate protection of our properties in all but extreme weather events. However, citing threats to endangered species (Chinook salmon), the County halted agreed upon annual maintenance, then only partially resumed it. The result has been property damaging elevated lake levels.

In 2008, the Corps - citing the accumulation of flow reducing restrictions - declared the flood control project defective, leaving the County to rectify the situation. More than a decade later, obstructions to flow, identified by the Corps, remain.

We respect the lake environment and the needs of the salmon. However, our property improvements were legally constructed with the understanding the Corps' flood control system would be adequately maintained resulting in appropriate water levels. That has not been the case, as attested to by an estimated \$10 million in damage to lakeshore properties in February 2020 due to a weather event that should not have produced such losses.

In Attachment A you will find a document we prepared to assess the impacts suffered by residents last year and to appeal for help from King County, federal agencies, and cities around the lake. Our effort included a petition listing specific requests and resulted in more than 250 petition signatures from our neighbors (Attachment B). Despite these pleadings, there has been no action to remedy the defects identified by the Corps.


We now ask that your office take the necessary steps to provide the Corps of Engineers and King County an immediate directive to halt any efforts that would further degrade flow capacity of the flood control project and to proceed with restoration of the intended flow capacity of the entire project. That direction should include the specific actions we enumerate in Attachment C.

Attachment C - Actions Needed

Background

The Corps and King County have an agreement whereby the county is to perform annual maintenance and routine inspection of the flood control project in the Sammamish River, including a critical portion called the Transition Zone. Maintenance is to consist of removal of flow-restricting vegetation and other obstacles. However, the county has recently declared its intent to make several modifications to the river, such as the introduction of woody debris, as well as changes to its maintenance process, that would likely further diminish lake outflow capacity. Fish and environmental factors drive these changes, and the county asserts that these considerations outweigh the need to provide requisite outflow designed and implemented by the Corps.

It is WSSA's understanding that recent rulings by the federal claims court (Ideker Farms Vs US ACOE) have determined that flood protections cannot simply be abandoned for these other considerations. This supports WSSA and lake resident appeals that the agreement between the county and the Corps should be enforced. And, as shown below an independent analysis needs to occur before the introduction of further flow-restricting measures. The Corps should be pro-active and provide oversight.

Actions Requested

The Corps should be directed to do the following as regards the Flood Control Project (FCP):

STOP WORK – Assure that King County and other agencies cease all activities within the FCP that could impact lake water levels except for previously agreed activity. Specifically, proposed changes to annual maintenance in the section known as the Transition Zone should not be permitted under Corps Section 408. Only routine brush maintenance should occur, no mitigation downstream or placement of Large Woody Debris.

PUBLIC PROCESS - Establish a public involvement process carried out under Corps leadership.

INSPECTION TEAM - Establish a joint project inspection team (PI Team) composed of county, Corps, and local jurisdictions (with observer rights for residents or their representative).

PROJECT INSPECTION – Immediately carry out inspections of the entire river documenting – (a) the nature and location of each obstruction, (b) their importance to lake level management, fish protection and wetlands, and (c) rating of need for action to remove or mitigate each obstruction focusing on restoration of the Corps' design flow in the entire river.

CONCEPT EVALUATION - Immediately commence an independent review of the viability and effectiveness of a flow control gate at the Transition Zone (aka dynamic weir) to provide advance lowering of lake levels and, thereby, a reduction of property damage.

REVISE AGREEMENT - Update the Operation & Maintenance agreement recognizing the goals reflected above.
